Having more than two operational years behind this edition of Annual Report consolidates the accomplishments of the Foundation and the impact of interventions upon the overall goals to improve sustainability amongst the rural poor, small & marginal people. The Foundation interventions on sustainable agriculture, organic farming, sustainable livelihood pattern, health, advocacy, gender equality and prompted the process of social change.

The last two years of our work is dedicated to the cultivators who have been working in agricultural fields since decades. To make a sustainable & pollution free environment, we prioritised the organic farming among the farmers. Now the farmers are cultivating vegetables organically. For better yield with the help of Department of Aggriculture, Govt. Of Odisha we have promoted the System of Rice Intensification (SRI) among the farmers which will help the farmers on a long term basic. During the procsees we have given more space to the Women Farmers for improvement our farm land and the cultivation pattern.

On this occasion, I personally welcome my sincere appreciation to all the staffs of Social Development Foundation who have made these to reality. I hope this annual report will provide significant & valueable Information's relating to major activities taken up in Grassroot sector by Social Development Foundation, Angul Odisha during the year 2012-2013.

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1. Education

Illiteracy, access to primary education are two major obstacles in mainstreaming of the rural poor. Due to these often people remains poor. No one can deny the role of education in the development.

Overall Objective

The overall objective of the initiative is to facilitate the social change and development process by improving the access of children to elementary education.

Specific objectives of the initiative are:

- To aware the community about the need for education of girls, and improve their participation.
- To create a pool of literate change makers, who will be able to take the process of education
- To create a platform where the people can themselves analyses the problems and evaluate the alternatives

During the Year Social Development foundation ensured regular interaction of the parents and Teacher Association. Along with this the foundation facilitated the School Management Committee meeting in Balhar UP School, Santhapada High School of Talcher block and Kaniha High School. The foundation also organized a training programme on Right to Education (RTE) in Rengali U.P School and Baliposi U.P. School of Kaniha and Pallhara Block. A total of 48 persons participated in the meeting. The topics discussed during the meeting are.

- Right to Education Act. A Historical Perspective
- The Odisha State Rules and Status of Odisha in implementing the RTE Act
- School Management Committees
- Teacher recruitment and training
- Critical Gaps in implementation of the RTE in Odisha

2. Health

Although several flagship programmes on health are being implemented by the state and central Govts. The health parameters of Odisha are not an astonishing one. There are still miles to go.

As one of the priority area, the foundation initiated many programmes in its operational area.

2.1 Observation of National Safe Motherhood Day

The Foundation observed the National Safe Motherhood Day on 11th April 2012 at Jamardiha PHC (new) of Pallahara Block. Inaugurating the programme Mrs. Pratima Rath C.D.P.O. of Pallahara Block Explained safe delivery to the mothers, Antenatal care of pregnant women , post natal care, Mamata Yojona, Janani Sishu Surakhya Karyakrama ,Health card etc .Mr. Santosh Maharana BPO of Khamar



to help this programme. Total 52 ASHAs, AWW, SHG Members participated in the programme. The topics were discussed as follows

- Safe motherhood & safe delivery
- Antenatal care of PW
- Post natal care
- Orientation on implementation of new scheme- Mamata Yojona, Janani Sishu Surakhya

Reacting to the effort people of the area appreciated the effort and asked to the agencies to continue with such efforts so that people can get the benefit of different schemes and the awareness level among masses

2.2 World Breast Feeding Week-

The Foundation had organised a World Breast Feeding Week on dated 03/08/12 at Balugaon Village of Kandhal Gram Panchayat of Talcher Block .The programme was formally inaugurated by Sri Rangadhar Nahak Sarapanch of Kandhal G.P. A total of 48 Women's including ASHA, ANM, Anganwadi & SHG Members participated in the programme .The major topics which were discussed in the programme-



- Mother's milk is best for your babies.
- Necessity & importance of breast feeding for mothers & Babies.
- Mother milk is most importance from two minutes of birth towards for two years.
- Breast feeding is the best measurement for babies (Safety, Immune, forever)

2.3 Awareness programme on Malaria, Dengue & Diarrhoea

Due to lack of awareness diseases like Malaria, Dengu & Dioreaha is spreading in the area. Taking the stock of the situation the foundation organised a one day Awareness programme on Malaria, Dengue & Diarrhoea at- Gurujang Gram Panchayat Hall of Talcher Block on Dt 12/08/2012. More than 108 men & women including ASHA, ANM, Anganwadi Workers & SHG members participated in the programme. The Major Topics were discussed as follows –



- What is Dengue & Malaria
- How Malaria & Dengue Appear.
- Symptom of malaria & Dengue
- Prevention and precaution of malaria & Dengue
- Prevention and precaution Diarrhoea

2.4 Training programme on HIV/AIDs

Angul is now the 2nd highest HIV/AIDs prevalence in the state, Many of the infections are contracted due to unsafe sex and day by day the list of infections is growing. Social stigma is also another factor for which many of the cases goes unreported. At this movement the foundation organizes a training programme on HIV/AIDS. The basic objective of the programme is to raise the awareness level among commons

The programme was inaugurated by Mr. Muralidhar Behera Sarapanch of Gurujanguli and Dr. Ashok Pradhan, MD elaborated the details of HIV/AIDS. A total of 52 persons participated in the training programme which includes ASHAs, Angana Wadi Workers, SHG groups, ANM of Gurujanguli Panchayat.

Topics Discussed are:-

- What is HIV/AIDS
- Causes of HIV/AIDs
- Symptoms and Management of infection in +ve peoples.
- Treatment of HIV/AIDs
- Prevention and control of HIV /AIDS

2.5 Training Programme for Anganwadi Workers

ICDS is one of the oldest food and nutritional security schemes running in the country. Since its inception it is providing day care, referral, nutritional security to the children and the pregnant mothers, The foundation organised 2 training programme for the Anganwadi workers of Ghantapada, Santhapada of Talcher and Banarpal Block. The programme was organised during the month of February 2013. A total of 24 Anganwadi workers participated in the programme. The provisions of Integrated Child Development Schemes like Supplementary Nutrition, Immunization, Health Check-up, Referral Services, Non-formal Pre-school Education, Nutrition & Health Education were reviewed during the workshops. Issues like

- Lack of People's Participation
- Minimum awareness level among peoples
- Less Women's Participation
- Lacuna's in Monitoring process
- Lengthy govt. Procedures

Were discussed with the Anganwadi Workers. Mr. Budhadev Das , Secretary and Mr. Ashis Das, Consultant of the foundation Coordinated the event.

2.6 Training programme for FLWs

ASHAs are now playing a vital role in reducing the MMR and IMR. They are also ensuring the safe motherhood. Equipping them with knowledge is one of the core activities of the Foundation. The foundation organised 2 training programme for the ASHA's of Santhapada and Ghantpara Panchayat of Talcher Block. The objective of the programme is to to avoid the three delays i.e. recognition of danger signs; Seek medical care in case of complication; and Identify and access medical facilities for obstetric complications that occurred during the pregnancy hours . A total of 30 ASHAs participated in the Training Programme.

Section 3 Agriculture

The state's economy is a agriculture economy. 60% of our population lives in rural area and depends on agriculture. Since ages they are practicing the age old method of cultivation. After the independence this sector has seen many challenges and changes and still there is a huge potential for the progress. Taking the opportunity the foundation promoted the advance technology in the sector and also the organic Farming. The details of our interventions are given below.

3.1 Seed Treatment Campaign.

Seed Treatment is one of the major components of integrated pest management in crop protection. Pest Management strategies are designed to prolong the life of pest measures by ensuring that insects don't rapidly develop resistance to the chemicals used to control the pest. Most seed treatment products are fungicides of insecticides applied to seed before planting.



The foundation organised a Seed Treatment Campaign (Kharif 2012/13) & Seed Treatment Campaign Rabi 2012-



2013 In 14 villages in the name of “Bihan Bishodhan Abhijan” From 24th April to 24th May & 1st Nov to 30th Nov 2012 in District Agriculture Office, Angul Circle. The Over all objective is to create awareness to protect the crop from various pests and diseases among the farmers. The main Objectives of the campaign

is create more awareness among farmers to go for seed treatment & bridge the gap between the productivity & field highlighting on techniques and its positive aspects for better yeild. The Total seed treatment campaign was a success in respect farmer's participation participatory approach. A Total of 2800 Farmers participated and trained through the programme. With this the foundation shared the knowledge of

3.2 Line Sowing and Line Transplanting Under RKVY:-

Due to low yielding paddy is no more an interest crop for farmers. Addressing the problem the Foundation has given top most priority on production of paddy. disseminating.

During the year the foundation had been take up Paddy cultivation by line sowing and line

transplanting practices in 300 Ha of Banuasahi, Bimalbeda, Kanjara, Rautal, Kushasingha, Dabardhua, Kuio, jamunali, Sakosinga, Kumanda,

Jarasingha, Turang, Kurudol, Tentoloi, Raganipal, BalaramPrasad, Kulad, Girang, Kandsar, Gotomara, Apartipur, Budhapanka, Kankinali, Nuahata, Bauligada, Bonda, Talamulsasan, Harichandrapur, Serenabeda, Mahidharpur villages of Banarpal Block under the RKVY plan benefiting 1500 farmers



3.3 Line Sowing and Line Transplanting under State plan:-

The foundation has undertakne 125 ha of paddy cultivation by line showing and line transplanting under the state plan through participatory approach in Banarpal and Kaniha Block of Angul benefiting 600 farmers



3.4 System of Rice Intensification (SRI)

Popularising the System of Rice Intensification practice (SRI) the foundation had been take up 50 Ha SRI in Khulua, Padibhanga, Nuagaon, Lingarakata Villages of Talcher Block benefiting 200 farmers.

Advocating for a pollution free environment and challenging the delusion of the so-called green revolution along with the use of chemical fertiliser and pesticides in agriculture a series of workshop on organic farming & bio-pesticides uses was organised from 16th January 2013 January to 13th February 2013 in Bimalbeda, Tasera, Paratara, Rautal villages of Banarpal Block. As many as 50 farmers from each village participated in the workshop. Mr. Sachidananda Panda District Agriculture Officer cum PPO, Angul inaugurated the Workshop. Mr.Budhadev Das Secretary, Social Development



Foundation facilitated the workshop. Mr. Prafulla Kumar Swain DDH Angul, Mr. Nikunja Kishore Rout, Mr. Ajay Kumar Parida, Mr. Niranjana Das KVK Angul are also invited as a resource person in the workshop. Mr. Sumant Kumar Nayak AAO, Banarpal put his views in favour of the system of organic farming. Mr. Mahadev Das gave vote of thanks to all farmers for attending the workshop. 4. Women Empowerment:

4.1 SHG Training:

Women Plays a vital role in stabilising and managing the household economy. Looking at this the foundation started the SHG training programme in Baliposi Panchayat of Pallahara block. A Total 4 training programmes were organised involving 8 SHG groups. Total 52 members participated in the training programme. The details of the training are as follows.

5. Advocacy

5.1 Training programme on Right to Information:

The foundation had organised two training programme in Kaniha and Banarpal block of Angul District during the month of January 2011. A total of 75 participants were trained on different aspects of Right to Information. The issues covered in the meeting are as follows.

5.2 Training programme on Right to Food:

5.3 Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA)

The National Rural Employment Guarantee Act 2005 guarantees one hundred days of employment in a financial year to any rural household whose adult members are willing to do unskilled manual work at statutory minimum wage. The Primary objective of these programme was to generate awareness among the PRI Representatives, Village level Govt Officers and the community leaders on NREGA. In this Issues, Social Development Foundation had attained the Block Level public Hearing on



MGNREGA on Dt-17-01-13 at-Banarpal Panchayat Samiti Meeting Hall and the Same Public Hearing attained from SDF on Dt-18-01-13 at –Sabha Ghar, Talcher .

Major Provision of MGNREGA as Highlighted:

- Employment available 15days of application submitted
- Worksite within 5 k.m.s radius of the village
- Wage payment within 15 days
- Drinking water facilities at worksite
- In case work place more than this specified distance 10% of more wages to be paid.
- Farm Pond , Horticulture Activities ,

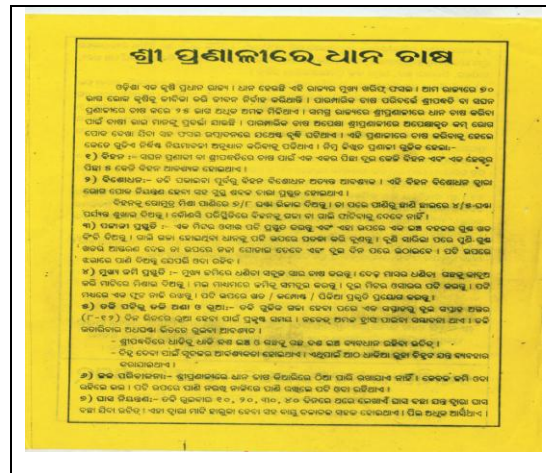

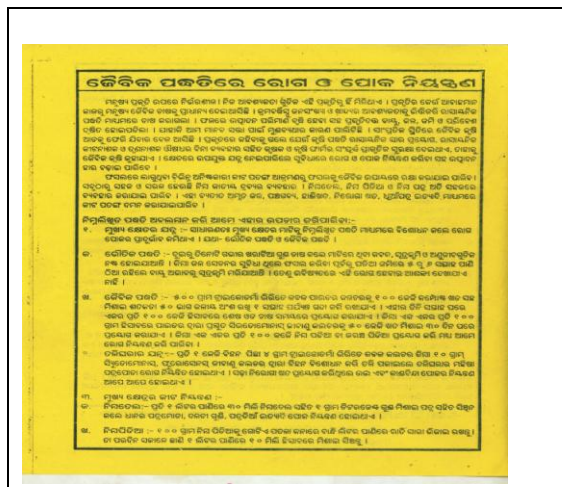
