1. Education

Literacy is traditionally meant as the ability to read and write. The key to literacy is reading development , a profession of skill that begins with the ability to understand spoken words and decode written words and culminates in the deep understanding the text. Literacy involves a continuum of learning in enabling individuals to achieve their goals to develop their knowledge and potential and participate fully in their community and wider society.

Education is vital and this can build on to solve other issues of society. A One day awareness programmes were organized during the year involving School Management Committee, AWW, SHG members, where they were motivated to send their children to school and to make them educated. This has been positively impacted and most of the SHG members were sending their children to school. Education plays a vital role in empowering the community.

1. 1. International Literacy Day

Through its efforts SDF facilitated many School Management Committees Meetings (SMCs) and parent teacher committees in Angul/Kaniha /Pallahara/Talcher/Balangir block. Along with this the organisation organised a One day awareness programmes on International Literacy Day at-Dhumamara Primary school in associate with **Jayanarayan Trust ,Talcher** and school management committees on Dt-8th September of 2017.The programme was attend by Mrs.Barsha Harpal District Social Auditor MGNREGS,DRDA Balangir enlightened the school children's by sharing her ideas and experience. The foundation throughout the operational area tries to raise the awareness level of people for girl child education and ensured the implementation of Right to Education, Child Rights Programme etc.

2. Health

In line with our commitment to “Health for All” we have a regular programme for organizing health camps which apart from providing solutions, Focus on information dissemination and preventive healthcare facilities. Rural health care is one of the biggest challenges that India is facing today. High Mortality rates are subjected to poor health care facilities in the rural areas of India.

Health is a state of physical, mental and social wellbeing. The state & central government has very crucial role in providing quality health services to the people of the state. Although several flagship programme on health are being implemented by the state & central governments. The Health Parameters of Odisha are not an astonished one. There are stills miles to go. As one of the priority area, the foundation initiated many health related programmes in its operational area during the year. The community involvement is an essential component for successful implementation of the programme. Let us all make concerted efforts for provision of affordable quality health care to the people of the state.

2.1 **World Breastfeeding week**

The Foundation had organised a World Breast Feeding Week on dated 03/08/12 at-Sendhagaon Village of Bantol Gram Panchayat of Talcher Block .The programme was formally inaugurated by Smt.Pratima Pattnaik Ward Member of Sendhagaon Bantol G.P. A total of 21 Women’s including ASHA, ANM, Anganwadi & SHG Members participated in the programme .

The major topics which were discussed in the programme-

- I. Mother’s milk is best for your babies.
- II. Necessity & importance of breast feeding for mothers & Babies.
- III. Mother milk is most importance from two minutes of birth towards for two years.
- IV. Breast feeding is the best measurement for babies (Safety, Immune, forever)

3. Livelihood

3.1: System of Rice Intensification (SRI)

Rice is life for millions of people in the world, particularly in developing countries. It is the main cereal for majority population in India. The demand for rice is growing with ever-increasing population. Rice is water intensive crop. More than 70 percent of the country's ground and surface water is being used for agriculture, and out of this, 70 percent is allocated to rice cultivation. Each kg of rice produced with irrigation requires 3000-5000 liters of water.

With the past experience the farmers of the Pallahara/ block were guided technically for promotion of Paddy cultivation following SRI method. Necessary training, awareness and follow up were made by the trained volunteers of Organization and around 20 Ha. of SRI Paddy was promoted successfully. Now the Due to better yield enhancement in SRI, the farmers are adopting this method to cultivate paddy. It involves lower seed rate, lower chemical fertilizer use, less use of plant protection chemicals and low water consumption. The overall objective is to create awareness among the farmers regarding the importance of **System of Rice Intensification (SRI)**, which are as follows

- ❖ Preparing high-quality land
- ❖ Preferring compost or farmyard manure to synthetic fertilizers
- ❖ Developing nutrient-rich and un-flooded nurseries
- ❖ Using young seedlings for early transplantation
- ❖ Ensuring wider spacing between seedlings
- ❖ Transplanting the seedlings singly
- ❖ Frequent inter cultivation with weeder
- ❖ Managing water carefully so that the plants' root zones moisten, but are not continuously submerged

3.2: Training Programme on Organic Cultivation for SHG's Members

The Women farmers of the target area of Banarpal block and Pallahara block were given hand hold field training by our field staffs / experts on organic farming, vegetable cultivation, SRI & Seed Treatment etc. This has helped them to achieve better production and productivity. By simple seed treatments farmers can reduce half of the diseases in crops. This can be done both organically and by using pesticides.

The training programme was organized to improve the income generation capacity of farmers through organic vegetable cultivation technology and through linkages with different institutions, was inaugurated by **Mr. Bipin Barik Development Consultant Bhubaneswar** , PRI's and technical staff of FIAC, Banarpal were present in the inaugural session. The topics of the training programme covered field preparation, nursery management, nutrient and irrigation management, pest and disease management, organic farming and post harvest management of vegetable crops. The valedictory function was chaired by the Secretary, Social Development Foundation Sri. Budhadev Das, who expressed his satisfaction on the successful conduct of the first capacity building training programme at- Sakosinga , Jamunali of Banarpal. The training programme was coordinated by Sri. Mahadev Das, Rajesh Kumar Das, Rishav Sahoo etc SDF Talcher.

The overall objective is to create awareness among the women farmers regarding the importance of organic farming , which are as follows

1. To develop a sustainable agriculture system for guaranteed adequate food production in the foreseeable future.
2. To develop self-sufficient agriculture system which would rely as much as possible upon resources from within its own resources.
3. To develop an alternative strategy over chemical farming which would be a guideline for the working of biological processes in natural eco-system

3.3 Training programme on Backyard Kitchen Garden for SHG's Members

Farmers of rural Odisha with small backyard spaces have been using this space for commercial monoculture and disposing the produce in local market. However while purchasing the vegetables for household purpose from the same local market the poor farmer has an obvious habit of purchasing the cheap vegetables irrespective of their nutritive value.

This practice deprived them of a combination of nutritive vegetables from their menu especially due to higher prices. This issue has been addresses under “My Vegetable & My Land” project “Sustainable livelihood improvement through integrated Farming, Organic cultivation, horticulture and livestock development in Angul Block & Balangir districts of Orissa” through backyard kitchen gardening . model proposed by Social Development Foundation ,Talcher to the selected beneficiaries.

3.4 Foundation's Participation in Major workshop cum Seminar

The organization was participated at different programmes organized at district level and block level and by leading NGOs on different social development and livelihood issues. Participated at District level workshop, where SIR, paddy cultivation, organic farming, etc were demonstrated. Farmers were also coordinated and guided to participate at such programmes for up gradation of skill and knowledge.

3.4.1 State Level Organic Farmers' Convention.

Social Development Foundation was participated in State Level Organic Farmers' Convention was organised by Agrabamee (sponsored by Rosa Luxemburg Stiftung, Germany) at The Institute of Engineers Bhubaneswar on 27th October 2017. Farmer from ten backward and tribal district were participated in this convention. Mr.R.Balakrishnan- IAS, Development Commision; Mr.Devinder Sharma- Distinguished Food and Trade Policy Analisist; Prof. Radhamohan- Eminent Environmentalist; Mr.Ranglal Jamuda-Chairman, Odisha State Food Commission; Mr.Basant Kar; Mr.Pravesh Sharma; Mr.EkadashiNandi; Mr.Raju Titus- Successful Organic Farmer were honorable Chief Guest of this Convention. This program was an unique aspect of participation of farmers and specialist in an important discussion related to various issues and remedies of organic farming.

4. Women Empowerment

Women empowerment is the process in which women expand and recreate what is that they can be , do and accomplish in a circumstance that they previously denied. Capacity building aims to strengthen women's ability to work together for their mutual benefit by providing them with the skills and tools they need to define existing challenges and issues and formulate relevant solutions.

Vegetable farming is the growing of vegetables for human consumption. The practice probably started in several parts of the world over ten thousand years ago, with families growing vegetables for their own consumption or to trade locally. At first manual labour was used but in time livestock were domesticated and the ground could be turned by the plough. More recently, mechanization has revolutionized vegetable farming with nearly all processes being able to be performed by machine. Due to the needs to market vegetables while fresh, vegetable gardening has high labor demands.

Looking in the scenario, **Social Development Foundation** an organization committed for conservation of the farmers and ecology took steps to promote organic vegetable farming and conservation. Along with the **NABARD, Bhubaneswar** a series of Training programme on Vegetable cultivation for Mature SHG Members under MEDP from 4th June to 30th June of 2017.

4.1 . Training programme on Vegetable cultivation for Mature SHG Members under MEDP

➤ Objective

The broad objectives of the programmes are:

1. Maximizing of production and components of vegetable cultivation
2. Creating best practices of farming
3. Adoption of economical method
4. Productivity & profitability
5. Stability & sustainability
6. Different aspects of Marketing

Social Development Foundation, Talcher had organized 1st training programme on vegetable cultivation for mature SHG Members at –Kuio village of Banarpal Block, Angul Dist on dt-04-06-2017 -08-06-2017. Social Development Foundation, Talcher as the NGO Partner of NABARD was involved in selection of beneficiaries and rendering technical advice with the help of Agriculture & Horticulture dept staff. Mr. Sumant Kumar Nayak AAO,BANARPAL, Mr. Dillip Ku Sahu , AAO Angul , Mr Amiya Ku Swain AHO, Banarpal , **Mr.Bhramarbar Behera, AHO Pallahara** , Mr .Chandrasekhar Mahapatra Expert Livelihood from BIPF,IMFA Choudwar etc facilitate the training programme. **On this occasion Pranab Kishor Jena DDM , NABARD enlightened the participants by sharing their ideas and experiences.**

In order to help the SHG for their sustainability in agriculture in rural and remote area of Angul, dist. **Social Development Foundation, Talcher** has create massive awareness on for better product and productivity of vegetable cultivation.

4.2. Capacity building program for SHG members on organic vegetable cultivation.

With the growing awareness for safe and healthy food among consumers and growing concern deteriorating soil health and fertility and depleting natural resources among policy planners strategy are being drawn to adopt technologies promising safe and healthy food with due respect to the natural resources availability without compromising the productivity and food security. Keeping in this traditional Social Development Foundation organized a Capacity building program for SHG members on organic vegetable cultivation with Jayanarayan Trust, Talcher and Community people of **Chandanbhati Balangir** Dist Odisha on dt-19th September of 2017. At the outset Mr. Budhadev Das, Director of Social Development Foundation welcomed all the participants and dignitaries. S. J. Bhagbat Prasad Rath Agril. Engineer of DRDA, Balangir Inaugurated the programme and enlightened the Organic Cultivation in present context. Mrs. Barsha Harpal DSA, Balangir had joined in this programme and sharing schemes under MGNREGS for organic manure, vermi compost, vermi wash etc. BPM OLM, Balangir actively participated in the said programme. As many as 65 SHG's members were participated in the said programme.

Target group's participation and impact Analysis

The training programme was a success in respect to SHGs participation, in participatory approach. SHG's irrespective of caste, social status participated in the training programme. Govt officials also participated and facilitated the process of the training programme. A total of 30 SHG's participated each training and train through the programme. Self Help Groups of Kuio, Jamunali, Jamardihi, Chandanbhati, were exposed to knowledge's like raising seedling, seed treatment, land preparation, vermi-compost Green Mannering, Bio-fertilizer, Importance of trellis system, post harvesting management, cleaning, grading, packing, Value addition, marketing, linkages with banks & effective credit management means. The trainees have got immense knowledge and built up their skill after attending 5 days qualitative training on vegetable cultivation by the experienced experts/resource persons. All the concerned initiatives have made them as successful entrepreneurs which encouraging the SHG's in the vicinity.

4.3. Grassroots Level Training Programme for SHG's

Social Development Foundation, Talcher has promoted Grassroots Level Training Programme for SHG's in Kantiapasi, Khamar, Kantala villages of Pallahara Block of Angul Dist with esteem support of NABARD. We have conducted this program and secured the presence of President and Secretary of SHG's. About 90 participants have been trained on various facets of Financial Literacy, Dus Sutra (OLM). Mr. BPM Pallahara, facilitate the training programme. On this occasion Pranab Kishor Jena DDM, NABARD enlightened the participants by sharing their ideas and experiences.

Target group's participation and impact Analysis

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5. Sanitation

Sanitation is the means of promoting **hygiene** through the prevention of human contact with hazards of wastes especially faeces, by proper treatment and disposal of the waste, often mixed into wastewater. These hazards may be physical, microbiological, biological or chemical agents of disease. Providing sanitation to people requires a systems approach, rather than only focusing on the toilet or wastewater treatment plant itself. The experience of the user, excreta and wastewater collection methods, transportation or conveyance of waste, treatment, and reuse or disposal is called the Sanitation chain and all need to be thoroughly considered.

The main objective of a sanitation system is to protect and promote human health by providing a clean environment and breaking the cycle of disease. Lack of improved sanitation access has serious health impact on human kind. In fact, by improving access to safe sanitation and changing hygiene behaviours, diarrhoea health impacts - the first death cause of child death under 5 - can be reduced significantly. Nowadays, one of the main challenge of sanitation is sustainability, especially in developing countries. Sanitation aspects are technological, institutional and social, good governance is required to manage it properly. It was estimated in 2015 that 2.4 billion (about 1 out of 3 people) lack access to improved sanitation facilities, and just under 1 billion continue to defecate openly. Sanitation is a human right, just like the human right to water. Lack of access to sanitation has an impact on health, dignity, and safety.

5.1. Swachh Bharat Mission:- Mahatma Gandhi said, "Sanitation is more than Independence" "Sanitation is essential part of healthy living. Social Development Foundation believes that, everyone should have access to sanitation, hygiene and safe drinking water at Door step. In this connection foundation organize a awareness cum signature campaign, dissemination workshop, community level meeting with GKS Members, ASHA, AWW, PRI's etc of Talcher, Angul, Banarpal, Kaniha and Pallahara Block of Angul Dist

5.2. Swachhta Hi Sewa:- Inauguration of Swachhta Hi Sewa 15th September – 2nd October, 2017 campaign in Balhar Village. In the presence of Sarapanch, Samiti Sabhya, PRI's members and Village President and also organized a "Padyatra" to spread a awareness, promotion and adoption of best Hygiene and sanitation practice within families, communities, schools and anganwadis.

6. NRM

7.Biju Kanya Ratna Yojana (BKRY)

The declining child Sex Ratio is a cause of concern in the state of Odisha. The Child Sex Ratio has declining from 967 in 1991 census to 953 as per 2001 census. It is further declined to 941 as per 2011 census. While the data of Odisha is better than the national average , the district variation in child sex ratio reveals that the districts of Nayagarh, Dhenkanal, Angul& Ganjam have the lowest child sex ratio (885,887,and 908 respectively) in the state.

The Government of Odisha is committed to address the issue of declining child ratio in the state in general and in low child sex ration districts in particular. In this Context, through Odisha State Policy for Girls and Women 2014, government has committed towards creating an environment for girls that promote equal opportunities, eliminates discrimination and ensures empowerment through changes in the societal attitudes. Thus a new Scheme Biju Kanya Ratna (Ama Kanya Ama Ratna) has been implemented in the state specifically in the districts of Angul, Dhenkanal and Ganjam form 2016-17 for a Period of 3years.

Overall Goal of the Scheme:-

Create an enabling environment for the Survival and development of the Girl child and secure her Dignity.

Objectives of the Scheme:-

- To prohibit gender biased sex Selection
- To ensure survival, health & nutrition of the girl child
- To ensure education & retention of girl child in school
- To sensitize and mobilize the community and all stakeholders towards the value of girl child.
- Take initiatives to encourage girls to express their views and to be heard, to participate actively, effectively and equally.

In This connection Social Development Foundation had organized a several workshop cum awareness programme on Biju Kanya Ratna (Ama Kanya Ama Ratna) at-School, Community Level in Angul Dist.
