2. 1. National Safe Motherhood Day -2018

India is the first country in all across the world to have officially declared a National Safe Motherhood Day.

Every year the members of WRAI selects a nationwide advocacy theme to celebrate National Safe Motherhood Day. The goal of the day is to increase awareness that every woman has a right to live and survive well during and after pregnancy and childbirth.

National Safe Motherhood Day also provides awareness on conventional healthcare and maternity facilities to pregnant and lactating women. The government of India has also strengthened implementation of Indira Gandhi Matritva Sahyog Yojna (IGMSY) maternity benefit scheme. Surviving childbirth is a basic right of every woman and our social responsibility. Securing institutional delivery, reducing anemia risk among women by providing them Iron-Folic Acid supplements and as well as provide them better pre and postnatal health care are necessary for mothers.

The day also promotes the prevention of child marriages because the child marriage is an indirect cause of maternal deaths. Women have right to good quality nutrition and healthcare services during and after pregnancy and childbirth, for this, we need to remove the barriers that contribute to maternal mortality would go a long way towards the goal of safe motherhood. On this occasion Social Development foundation , ICDS & Panchayat was jointly organised a **National Safe Motherhood Day** at-Harabereni on dt-11th April of 2018. AWC centre .30 women of different SHG groups were participated in this programme.

3.3.3- Study of Tribal Eco system

3.3.4 - Meeting for a Participatory study on Farm Eco system :-

A farm is an **ecosystem** because it is made of living and non-living things that interact and exchange energy. 5.2. World Toilet Day

World Toilet Day is a day to take action. It is a day to raise awareness about all people who do not have access to a toilet – despite the human right to water and sanitation.

It is a day to do something about it. Sanitation is a global development priority. Toilets are important because access to a safe functioning toilet has a positive impact on public health, human dignity, and personal safety, especially for women. Sanitation systems that do not safely treat excreta allow the spread of disease. Serious soil-transmitted diseases and waterborne diseases such as cholera, diarrhoea, typhoid, dysentery and schistosomiasis can result. 07. Biju Kanya Ratna Yojana (BKRY)

The declining child Sex Ratio is a cause of concern in the state of Odisha. The Child Sex Ratio has declining from 967 in 1991 census to 953 as per 2001 census. It is further declined to 941 as per 2011 census. While the data of Odisha is better than the national average , the district variation in child sex ratio reveals that the districts of Nayagarh, Dhenkanal, Angul& Ganjam have the lowest child sex ratio (885,887,and 908 respectively) in the state.

The Government of Odisha is committed to address the issue of declining child ratio in the state in general and in low child sex ration districts in particular. In this Context, through Odisha State Policy for Girls and Women 2014, government has committed towards creating an environment for girls that promote equal opportunities, eliminates discrimination and ensures empowerment through changes in the societal attitudes. Thus a new Scheme Biju Kanya Ratna (Ama Kanya Ama Ratna) has been implemented in the state specifically in the districts of Angul, Dhenkanal and Ganjam form 2016-17 for a Period of 3years.

Overall Goal of the Scheme:-

Create an enabling environment for the Survival and development of the Girl child and secure her Dignity.

Objectives of the Scheme:-

- To prohibit gender biased sex Selection
- To ensure survival, health & nutrition of the girl child
- To ensure education & retention of girl child in school
- To sensitize and mobilize the community and all stakeholders towards the value of girl child.
- Take initiatives to encourage girls to express their views and to be heard, to participate actively, effectively and equally.
