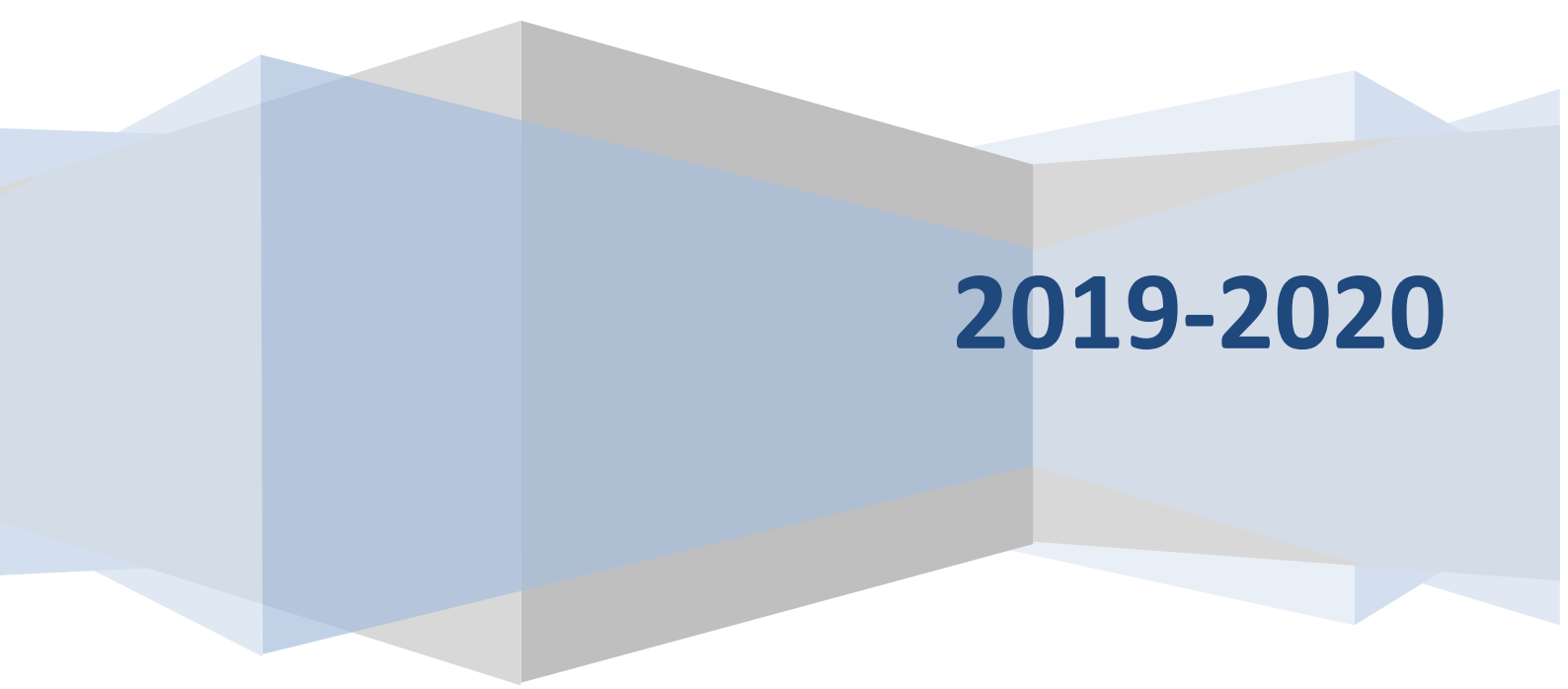

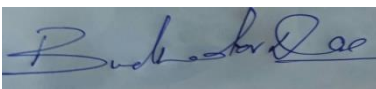

1} Agriculture

Agriculture is the science and art of cultivating plants and livestock. Agriculture was the key development in the Global human civilization where farming of domesticated species created food surpluses that enabled people to live in cities. The history of agriculture began thousands of years ago. From the twentieth century, intensive agriculture has increased the productivity. It substituted synthetic fertilizers and pesticides for labour which caused increased water pollution and often involved farm subsidies. In recent years there has been a backlash against the environmental effects on conventional agriculture resulting in organic, regenerative, and sustainable agriculture movements.

1.1 Organic Vegetable Cultivation

Organic farming in India is gaining popularity day by day. Organic farming is based on understanding the ways of nature. Thus in other words organic farming is relying on the natural process to yield benefits so as to maintain a healthy soil, eat healthy food and grow healthy humans. There is a difference between organic farming and permaculture. The later depends on organic farming but it also includes lifestyle into organic gardening or farming.

Due to better yield enhancement in Organic Farming, the farmers are adopting this method to cultivate Vegetable. It involves lower seed rate, lower chemical fertilizer use, less use of plant protection chemicals and low water consumption. With the help of District Horticulture and District Agriculture office, Balangir our foundation could successfully implement the vegetable cultivation in 5 Ha at Phatabahal Village of Kushmel Panchayat. A total of 16 farmers cultivated vegetable through this practice. The After several initial interaction and meetings with the farmers, they learnt the methods like pest management, organic manure, organic farming, watering and etc. They were consulted on each and every point. Mr. Abani Sarangi, of Phatabahal village being a farmer, who also work as CRP for Social Development Foundation communicated with all small and marginal farmers and gave knowledge on the benefit of organic farming at Phatabahal G.P of Loisinga Block of Bolangir district.

1.2 System of Rice Intensification (SRI)

Due to better yield enhancement in SRI, the farmers are adopting this method for cultivating paddy. It involves lower seed rate, lower chemical fertilizer use, less use of plant protection chemicals and low water consumption. With the help of "Farm Information Advisory Committee, Loisinga (FIAC)" and "District Agriculture Dept." the foundation could successfully implemented the SRI cultivation in 10 Ha of land at Kushmel Panchayat. A total of 36 farmers cultivated paddy through this practice. Then after several initial interaction and meetings with the Farmers, they learnt the methods like pest management, organic manure, organic farming, watering and etc.

2} Health

Although several flagship programmes on health are being implemented by the state and central Govts. The health parameters of Odisha are not an astonishing one. There are still miles to reach. The community involvement is an essential component for successful implementation of the programme. On priority basis the foundation initiated many programmes in its operational area on health.

2.1 Observation of World Breast Feeding Week

World Breast Feeding Week was jointly organised by Social Development Foundation and ICDS, Talcher on dated 05/08/2019 at –Sabhaghar of Talcher Block .The programme was formally inaugurated by Mr. Pares Chandra Nayak (OAS- SB) former Sub collector of Talcher. Mrs. Lilabati Nag (CDPO) Talcher has addressed the guest and participants. Mr. Netrananda Mallick(BDO, OAS-SB) Talcher also participated as Guest of Honour. Dr. Diptiprabha Kara (CHC Godibandha) participated and enlightened on importance of Breast feeding to the participants. A total of 48 Women members were present including ASHA, ANM, Anganwadi & SHG members in the programme.

9.6 million People die each year from cancer. That's more than HIV/AIDS, malaria and tuberculosis combined .Cancer is a critical health and human issue. By 2030 experts project cancer deaths may rise to 13 million. The Social Development foundation and Spandan, Kandasar, Angul had jointly organised a one day Awareness programme on **World Cancer Day** at Utkal Youth Club Hall at KUJO of Jamunali Gram Panchayat of Banarpal Block on Dt 12/02/2020. More than 28 men & women including ASHA, ANM, Anganwadi Workers & SHG members participated in the programme.

3} Livelihood

Livelihood means “securing the necessities of life”. People whose livelihood depends on the rainforest. Small and marginal farmers play an essential role in driving forward India’s economy and growth. Despite cultivating nearly 85% of the viable land in the country, these farmers are disproportionately vulnerable to the effects of climate change, market shifts, and other production risks. Too often these farmers fall through the cracks unable to access the services they need to increase their incomes and prosper. After overcoming through all the difficulties we get along and take up sustainable livelihood programme for women to make their life secure at our operational area.

3.1 Training programme on Livelihood & Enterprise Development Programme on Mushroom farming and marketing

Paddy straw mushroom is an edible mushroom of the tropics and subtropics. In India this mushroom was first cultivated in early 1940’s. Mushrooms are a group of fleshy macroscopic fungi. They lack chlorophyll having heterotrophic mode of nutrition. They synthesize enzymes like cellulose and hemicelluloses which bring the substrate to available forms. Mushrooms live on dead matter as they are saprophytes.

The market for mushrooms continues to grow due to interest in their culinary, nutritional, and health benefits. They also show potential use in waste management. However as fungi mushrooms have a very different life cycles those from green plants. The choice of species to rise depends both on the growth media available and on market considerations. Small-scale mushroom production represents an opportunity for farmers interested in an additional enterprise and is a specialty option for farmers without much land.

Mushroom is a commercial crop. In Odisha mostly paddy straw mushroom and oyster mushroom are commercially cultivated. There is an increasing need of training on mushroom cultivation technology among the farmers and entrepreneurs as a result of good prospect for mushroom in the market. The training on mushroom cultivation technology for entrepreneurs is a flagship programme of NABARD, RO ODISHA which aims to facilitate the complete knowledge of mushroom production activity on commercial scale.

Looking in the scenario, Social Development Foundation, Talcher started working in Angul district since the year 2009. We began to work with the understanding to empower community & downtrodden people in a sustainable approach. The goal of the project is to “enable the poor households & PVTGS to sustainably ensure their livelihood and food security through promoting a more efficient, equitable, self-managed, optimum use of the natural resources, off-farm/ non-farm enterprise development and accessing the rights and entitlements due to them”.

Since last 10 years we have partnered with local governments, communities, and health systems to remove barriers in capacity building activities like women empowerment through SHG’s, Value of Girl Child,

Right based advocacy, Water & sanitation, Health & hygiene, Mother & child health care, Child Labour & Child Protection, livelihood security in Angul & Balangir Dist in convergence modality.

➤ Objective

The broad Objectives of the Programmes are:-

- Mushroom cultivation is easy and simple.
- Mushrooms have a short crop cycle.
- It is very good enterprise for small farmers and landless labourers.
- Its cultivation is labour intensive and other vast employment opportunities in rural areas. It can be taken up by farmers as cottage industry and as a source of additional income.

The objective of the training is to enable the participants to understand and put into the perspective for the need and justification of LEDP.

The target group involves SHG'S members of concern Villages of concern Gram Panchayat and NGO's staff of Social Development Foundation.

6.1 A day in the life of A woman entrepreneur Mrs. Arnnapurna Nanda

Arnnapurna Nanda, a women farmer of Tulasipada sahi, Sakosinga in Banarpal Block, Angul Dist .She use to cultivate vegetable in 10 cent of land. The production from field was insufficient for the family. Apart from that she was also cultivating paddy in high land to meet the needs of family. But that was also insufficient for family consumption. Once she heard from Social Development Foundations (NGO) staff and later from a neighbour about mushroom cultivation and marketing that is being organised by NABARD under LEDP scheme. She rushed to the Project coordinator (SDF NGO), CRP & Achiever Farmers to have conversation regarding the project and to get the apprehensions the most. A Project coordinator of SDF NGO informed about her to the Head Officer Talcher for supporting her (Smt. Arnnapurna Nanda) to undertake Mushroom cultivation and Marketing .During the last Rabi Session, **NABARD{R.O} & Social Development Foundation, Talcher** conducted a 7days training on Mushroom cultivation and Marketing. Smt. Arnnapurna Nanda attended the training initially. But she was hesitant to take up mushroom cultivation and Marketing. SDF Staff repeatedly visited her and clarified all her doubts. Then she started cultivation of mushroom in 1cent of land. Smt. Arnnapurna Nanda had put her efforts to make it effective. Also engaged her son & daughter in guarding the mushroom bed frequently, she consulted Master Trainer ,Trainer ,CRP & Staff of SDF NGO for quality spawn ,polythine, paddy straw & other raw material for mushroom cultivation etc. All her hard efforts were paid off and production was marvellous. In comparison to last financial year this year she earned a huge profit from Mushroom sale. In this Kharif session she is planning to cultivate mushroom in large area. At the end she emerged as an entrepreneur and quoted that “I will Never Forget NABARD & Social Development Foundation Staff’s for their help and support”. Smt. Arnnapurna Nanda is happy and satisfied with her new achievement.

7} Foundation's Participation in Major workshop cum Seminar

The organization had participated at different programmes organized by leading NGOs at district level and block level on different Gender, Health, E-Governance, Advocacy, Social development and livelihood issues. SDF participated at District level workshop where SRI, Paddy cultivation, organic farming, MGNREGS etc were demonstrated. Farmers were also coordinated and guided to participate at such programmes for upgradation of skill and knowledge.

7.1. Gender sensitive Grampanchayat Development Programme

Panchayats play a significant role in the effective and efficient implementation of flagship schemes on subjects of National Importance for transformation of rural India. As a non-profit NGO Social Development Foundation has a crucial role of helping the PRI, Senior Citizen, Youth, SHG to actualize the 'Peoples Planning Process' and thereby facilitating the preparation of the Village Development Plans in participatory approach in Bantol Panchayat of Talcher Block.

7.2. Gram Panchayat Development programme under MGNREGS

People use the forum of the Gram Sabha to discuss local governance and development issue, and make need-based plans for the village. On the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti and Lalbahadur Sastri Jayanti a Gram Sabha was held under MGNREGS at Bantol G.P Hall of Talcher Block. Social Development Foundation, Talcher a grassroot level NGO has been working as an implementing agency. SDF implemented the programme in participatory approach under MGNREGS. Around 150 plus participants participated in the said programme. Special thanks to Mr. Abanikanta Dehury, Sarpanch of Bantol Gram panchayat, Team SDF for smooth awareness among stakeholders.

7.3. Social Audit Gram Sabha under MGNREGS

The Social Audit Gram Sabha is a special forum which is not included in the 6 mandatory Gram Sabhas. The Social Audit Gram Sabha is mandated under Section 17 of the MGNREGs Act. Social Audit Gram Sabha is the primary forum for wage seekers to raise their voices, make demands and validate the findings of social audit. Odisha expands the social audit system through OSSAT. In this context Social Development Foundation [NGO] Talcher have participated on Social Audit Gram Sabha at Gurujanguli Panchayat of Talcher Block respectively.

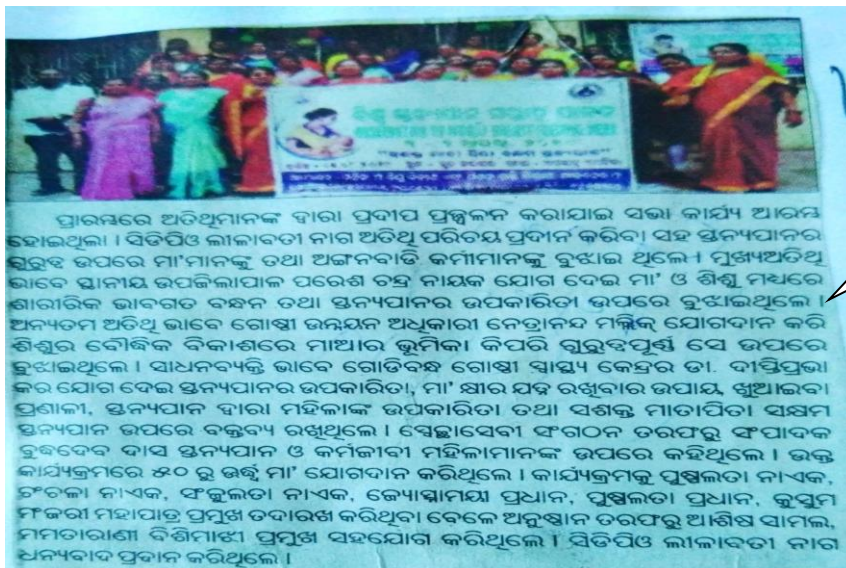
