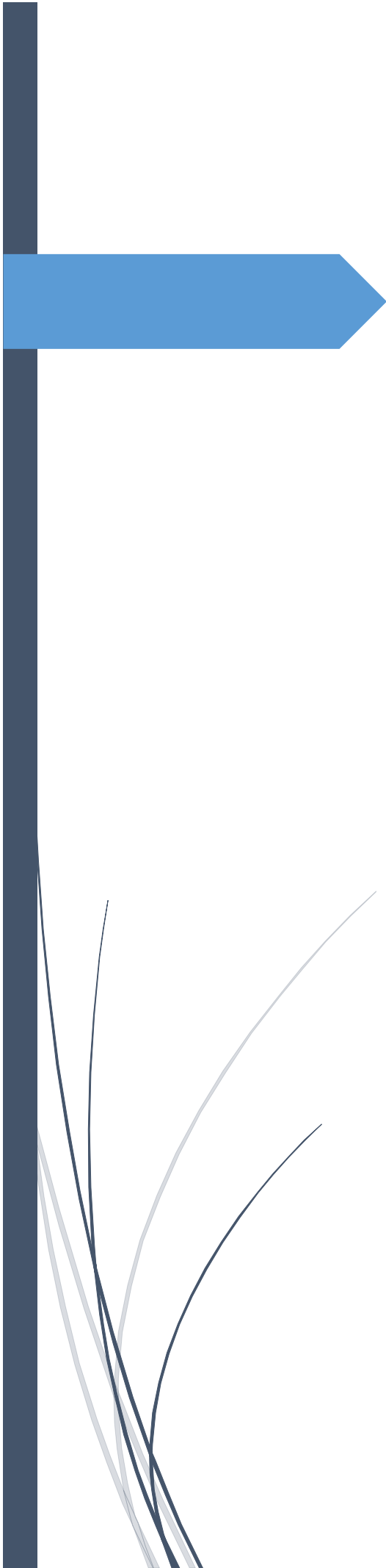

1} Agriculture

1.1 Line Transplanting and line sowing

Due to low yielding, paddy is no more an interest crop for farmers. Addressing the problem the Foundation has given top most priority on production of paddy. disseminating. During the year the foundation had been take up Paddy cultivation by line sowing and line transplanting practices in 5 Ha of Fatabahal Village of Kushmel G.P.,Loisinga Block of Balangir dist. under the project "My Vegetable-My Land" through participatory approach.

1.2 Backyard Kitchen Garden.

As day by day most of the areas are turning into concrete jungles and in order to earn a good livelihood most of the youth are moving towards urban area in search of jobs. As its hard to meet the ends of a normal person at a village. But at the same time there is one such village which set an example just opposite of the above scenario. Tolokulundi is part of Santhapada Gram Panchayat of Talcher Block where majority of population consist of tribal rest 20% SC and rest 10% general.

Today we got an opportunity to visit the place and meet the potential WSHGs who were involved in organic farming since many years, as we heard a lot about this village through various source. Through the Project "My Vegetable - My Land" model, women farmers of tolokulundi received a vegetable seed kit that comprises of Cauliflower, Brinjal, Bitter guard, snake guard, Tomato, chilli pumpkin etc. for Mo Wadi development.

During our visit we saw different types of cultivation such as brinjal, lady's finger, onion, ginger, garlic, green chilies, coriander, tomatoes, cabbage and mustard etc. and we also interacted with the WSHGs. During the interaction we got to know that they practice the method by using purely bio fertilizers. We informed them about providing income generation programme through convergence with Govt and corporate sectors. They were happy to hear this from us and asked us to give them some kind of training programme so that they can improve their skills. If support is provide "Doubling Farming" can also be introduced in this sector as per central Govt policy.

1.3 Panchayat level Food mela based on Millets.

Millets are a group of highly variable small-seeded grasses, widely grown around the world as cereal crops or grains for fodder and human food. Millets are important crops grown all over Asia. Early days it was only cultivated among indigenous group of people across continent. So it was called poor people's food and treated them in a different way. Due to globalization and migration of the indigenous people towards urbanization, these variety of cereals got extinct

somewhere during urbanization which is a serious matter of concern. In present context in agriculture sector while promoting green Revolution, Millets also play a vital role in health benefit and healthy environment for the society. After knowing all the benefits of millets, these new age group of people and government came forward and took initiative to promote these lost food in larger sector. In this context foundation has organised a panchayat level Millet recipes Mela at-Korada G.P Hall of Chhendipada Block, Angul Dist in presence of Chief District Officer, AAO Chhendipada, Official staff from Mission Shakti and cocerned Sarpanch.

1.4 Awareness programme on Millets

SDF has been putting its efforts for poor and marginalized, especially women for last 2 years towards operationalizing the Government schemes through panchayat and Line Dept. in relation to access maximum benefits of the product (Millet). Moreover, the organization is undertaking efforts to deepen understanding on system of Millet Intensification (SMI), awareness, training, workshop on Millets and capacity building programme through WSHG at Korada GP, Balipata GP and Durgapur GP of Chhendipada Block of Angul District and Jhiripani GP, Bhandarangi GP of Tumdibanda Block of Kandhamal district.

1.5 Formation of Producer Group

On Behalf of Social Development Foundation a farmer producer group has been created with involvement of progressive Farmer and it named as Koroda Organic Farmers Group.

2. Health & Hygiene

2.1 Menstrual Hygiene Day.

The menstrual hygiene awareness program aims to encourage hygienic practices during menstruation, to address myths & misconceptions and to enable adolescent girls to speak about menstrual issues without inhibition. Over the last 10 years the foundation is working with adolescent girls in angul dist. Founder of Social Development Foundation Budhadev Das ,Dr. Ajit Pattnaik and others stressed the need to exercise care while using and discarding sanitary pads.

2.2 National Nutritional Week.

In collaboration with Panchayat, our Foundation observed nutritional week at Rugudi Sahi of Sakosingha. 25 no of participants participated during this programme in presence of ASHA and AWW. Our coordinator carried out the programme and displayed various food product such as egg, fish, food grain, vegetables, milk and its products, green leafy etc. Participants were made aware about the nutritional values of the product present.

2.3 Awareness programme on COVID-19.

As COVID 19 is a dangerous pandemic. It aroused a threat among the people regarding their health. In this Pandemic situation Social Development Foundation, Talcher and NABARD organised an awareness programme on COVID-19 PANDEMIC with support of the WSHG's of Tulasipada Village of Sakosinga G.P. The programme was initiated by Kasturaba Group. "All these programmes were done for noble cause". As part of the campaign titled "Stay Home Stay Safe" The programme was to put an end to Corona" by distribution of pamphlets, masks, following social distancing norms, hand washing, personal hygiening and cleanness programme among their LEDP members. On the other way the Foundation in collaboration with Bantol gram Panchayat, Talcher involved in mask making. Raw material was provided to Shree Jagannath SHG and Bhagyalakshmi SHG through SDF NGO. Even the SHG members spared their time IN mask making. They stitched 5800 mask with that raw material and distributed with help of ASHA, ANM, AWW, PRI workers and volunteers of SDF. Our Foundation has organised awareness programme on social distancing, hand washing, personal hygiening, Cleanness and supplied raw food materials at-Munda Hating, Talcher.

3} Livelihood

3.1. Grassroot level Training programme for Mature SHG members.

With an aim to create awareness about Government schemes, financial literacy, digital literacy, group management techniques. NABARD and Social Development Foundation, Talcher had organised a Grassroot level training programme at-Bijigol G.P Hall of Kaniha Block .As many as 30 Women SHGs members were participated in these programmes

3.2.BLBC Exposoure visit .

As a part of NABARD's regular interventions in the field of micro Finance S. Sarat Ku Behera, DDM, NABARD, Angul organized a BLBC Members Exposure Visit to SHGs in the district wherein various bankers were taken to visit Self Help Groups (SHGs) to have first-hand on site exposure to SHGs. The Programme was held at village BONDA Gram panchayat Hall, Banarpal Block of Angul Dist on 24.11.2020. The SHGs have been promoted by NGO named Social Development Foundation {SDF}, Talcher with assistance from NABARD. Assistant LDM, Angul, Mission Shakti Co-ordinator Sarpanch of Bonda, and various bankers were present on the occasion apart from President and Secretary of 15 SHGs members were present on the occasion.

Addressing the gathering, DDM informed that NABARD has taken initiatives in Angul district and has promoted SHGs in the rural areas with the help of NGOs

3.3. Micro Enterprise Development Programme {MEDP} for matured SHG members on Phenyl Making .

Self-Help Group is a small voluntary association of poor people preferably from the same socio-economic back drop. In other words, Self-help group is a method of organising the poor people and the marginalized to come together to solve their individual problem. The SHG method is used by the government, NGOs and others worldwide. The poor collect their savings and save it in banks. In return they receive easy access to loans with a small rate of interest to start their micro unit enterprise. Thousands of the poor and the marginalized population in India are building their lives, their families and their society through Self-help groups. The 9th five year plan of the government of India had given due recognition on the importance and the relevance of the Self-help group method to implement developmental schemes at the grassroots level.

❑ Objective

The broad Objectives of the Programmes are:-

To enable the participants to understand and put into the perspective for the need and justification of MEDP.

❑ Mobility of rural women has increased for various socio- economic developmental activities through Micro Enterprise.

❑ Decision making capacity at household level as well as at community level has increased and become more meaningful.

❑ Realize the roles and responsibilities of Self Help Groups.

❑ Planning, Execution and Target Group

5} Success Stories

5.1 The Success Story of Farmer Who Dares to Dream.

As most of our farmers depend on farming for livelihood in India. Abani Sadhangi, 40, a farmer from Fatabahal village of Kusmel G.P, Loisinga Block of Balangir District. He along with his wife cultivates Paddy in 1 hector of land. Traditional cultivation of paddy was not so profitable for him. Paddy cultivation helped to meet his needs but no such savings was there. After receiving training on SRI, Organic farming, Line transplanting, pest management etc. from Social Development Foundation, Talcher a partner of NABARD, KVK Balangir, District Agriculture and Horticulture Office his method of farming changed.. So both husband and wife thought of cultivating organic vegetables such as Pumpkin, Onion, Tamatto and chilli in their field. Then he thought of expanding it as business by receiving a loan from People's Bank like as State Bank of India (SBI). Initially he borrowed Rs. 90.000/- and successfully paid it back. He used the loan

amount to buy a water pump, farming utilities, and vegetable seeds. He started selling vegetable to their neighbours and at the nearest local market (Balangir). After this the revenue he earned was much enough to meet his daily needs. He not only sold vegetable to his neighbours but also started selling to other nearby areas. Social Development Foundation, Balangir / Talcher supported him with providing different kinds of vegetable seeds for alternative income creation. He utilized the opportunity very well and stabilized his lifestyle. During the COVID-19 PANDEMIC his training and marketing on "On farming cultivation" skill earned him income and proved the well said scheme of GOI. "Doubling Farming". All their efforts were paid off. Currently he is associated with social development Foundation and working as Community Resource Person (CRP) for Loisinga Block of Balangir Dist.

5.2 Hard work never fails.

Here is the story of entrepreneurs who overcame the hurdles and obstructions of poverty, disappointment of unemployment yet rose above all of them with their unrelenting drive and strong will power. Going through a difficult phase of life, Mrs. Sipteemayee Sahoo and her group once expressed their woes to Mrs. Sumitra Barik {Anganwadi Worker-AWC-2, Bijigol}. Then AWW told them about professional training programs under MEDP offered by NABARD and Social Development Foundation, Talcher, Angul. This came as a pleasant news to them. As they had an aptitude for Phenyl Making, so they decided to visit the training center, which was held near their AWC Center. They attended the training program with new hopes, zeal and self confidence which they had never known before. They actively participated in training activities to acquire as much knowledge as they could on the subject. They found the training very informative, interesting and well-conceived. With an ambition to launch their own venture on completion of training, they started producing in small quantity from home for better experience. To launch their venture, they arranged capital from their group so as to avoid interest on loan. After doing a careful study of market potential, infrastructure and clientele base, they chose to base their venture at Bijigol, which

is also the Block Head Quarter and frequented by many people. Initially they started producing phenyl in small quantity and distributed near their local markets, hardware shops and hotel etc. in the brand name of “Jivan Raksha”. They got many positive response from their costumers and this made them more confident. They are also planning to visit NTPC Kaniha, Hospitals and Jindal steel plant for marketing. Now they are planning to make it to a larger scale, if NABARD, Banks, Govt agencies and corporate sector support with a Semi-automatic machine for Phenyl making. Now they are very happy with their new life which is due to NABARD, SDF and AWW and are very thankful to them

6} Foundation’s Participation in Major workshop cum Seminar

The organization had participated at different programmes organized at district level and block level and other leading NGOs on different social development and livelihood issues. Participated at District level workshop where SRI, paddy cultivation, organic farming etc. were demonstrated. Farmers were also coordinated and guided to participate at such programmes for up gradation of skill and knowledge.

6.1 9th RPDAC Meeting of NTPC/TTPS, Talcher.

RPDAC meeting was held at Conference hall at Collector’s office in presence RDC Sambalpur, Collector Angul, SP Angul, Sub Collector Talcher, Tehsildar Kaniha and Talcher along with presence of MP, MLA, NGOs, SHGs and NTPC officials. Points Discussed: 1. Battered people should be awarded their rightful remuneration along with job for their family members. 2. CSR activities to be carried out in proper manner.

6.2 AGRI-Clinics & AGRI-Business Centres(AC&ABC)
